

Weeks' Research Department is dedicated to bringing you the best in all types of new rose varieties – whether from our own hybridizing or from the efforts of international breeding firms or amateur stateside breeders.

Each year at our new research greenhouses on the campus of Cal Poly Pomona, we hand pollinate about 50,000 flowers to produce around 250,000 seeds. After a thorough 8 to 10 year

evaluation period, culminating in the All-America Rose Selections (AARS) trials, only about 4 to 5 varieties emerge from the group as truly superior and market-worthy.

Cinco de Mayo is the 14th AARS Award Winner to come from Weeks' research efforts, under the direction of Tom Carruth since 1988 and assisted by Christian Bédard since 2000. In the years to come, we will be bringing you many more excellent roses to grace your gardens.




ALL-AMERICA ROSE SELECTIONS

ROSEBERRY BLANKET

Roseberry Blanket

(cv. KORtwente) PPAF

Deep fuchsia pink. Shrub/Ground Cover

Terra firma never had it so good... a nice cozy blanket of glossy-glossy green foliage quilted with gobs of hot-hot pink blossoms. It's not a bashful addition to the landscape, but a bawdy bold fountain of color that requires no pampering. Just apply a little water & a little love.

Height/Habit: Low/Spreading

Bloom/Size: Medium-small, double

Petal Count: 15 to 20

Fragrance: Slight spice

Hybridizer: Kordes—2004

Parentage: Not released

Comments: Very consistent in all climates.

Electric Blanket

(cv. KORpancom) PPAF

Warm coral. Shrub/Ground Cover

The large double flowers of cozy coral separates this rose from other ground cover roses. Bearing the typical super-glossy super-resistant foliage you would expect from the Kordes roses, just plug it in & let her warm up a spot in your landscape. Low-maintenance, clean & colorful.

Height/Habit: Medium-low/Somewhat spreading

Bloom/Size: Medium, in clusters

Petal Count: 15 to 20

Fragrance: Light

Hybridizer: Kordes—1999

Parentage: Bella Rosa x White Max Graf

Comments: Consistent colorful coral.



INNOCENCIA™

Innocencia™

(cv. KORstarnow) PPAF

Bright white. Shrub

Imagine the whitest of white flowers set against a blanket of nearly black-green glossy leaves. This vigorous clean Kordes ground cover is one of Mother Nature's electric lights in landscape, glimmering even into the night. No extra voltage required.

Height/Habit: Medium-low/Compact

Bloom/Size: Medium-small, in clusters

Petal Count: About 15

Fragrance: Light apple

Hybridizer: Kordes—2003

Parentage: Not released

Comments: Also perfect in the border.



ELECTRIC BLANKET

Little Chap™

(cv. KORverlandus) PPAF

Cotton candy pink. Shrub/Ground Cover

This showy ground 'surfer' rides colorful waves of little ruffled flowers that 'hang ten' against the soil, spill down the side of raised wall or planter or weep from a standard tree. The truest ground cover of the bunch...you'll dig the billows of pink set against clean apple green leaves.

Height/Habit: Low/Very spreading

Bloom/Size: Small, ruffled, in clusters

Petal Count: 25 to 35

Fragrance: Mild

Hybridizer: Kordes—1997

Parentage: Not released

Comments: The truest Ground Cover habit.



LITTLE CHAP™

Sunrise Vigorosa™

(cv. KORsupigel) PPAF

Luminous yellow. Shrub/Ground Cover

Yellow is the more rare color amongst ground cover roses. And double flowered yellows are even scarcer. That's why we had to draw on the shrub & ground cover expertise of the famous Kordes family in Germany. The results are a large flowered luminous yellow with luscious glossy green leaves

Height/Habit: Medium-low/Slightly spreading

Bloom/Size: Medium, fully double

Petal Count: Over 50

Fragrance: Mild

Hybridizer: Kordes—2007

Parentage: Seedling x seedling

Comments: Holds the deeper color in cooler conditions.



Golden-orange/inside/bronzy-red out. **Grandiflora**

A topsy-turvy attention-getter, this bi-color medal-grabber makes your eyeballs salute cause the two colors are outside-in. Or is it inside-out? The lighter lasting golden-orange color is on the inside with a distinct darker bronzy-red outside. Yet it's not just the flying colors that will cause a flap. It's a turning point as a plant, too, with superb vigor, lush clean green leaves and loads of bloom. Very disease resistant.

Height/Habit: Tall/Very upright

Bloom/Size: Medium-large/fully double

Petal Count: Around 35

Fragrance: Light fresh-cut apple

Hybridizer: Carruth—2005

Parentage: [(O Sole Mio x seedling) x unknown] x Hot Cocoa

Comments: A far-out color & a way-out plant makes for a knock-out rose.

Angel Face

Clear medium lavender blushes of ruby. **Floribunda**
Loads of ruffled lavender blossoms permeate the air with the strong perfume of sweet citrus flowers. A perennial favorite because of the low bushy habit, the nearly continual production of blooms, the unusual color, and the sweet fragrance.

Height/Habit: Low/Rounded

Bloom/Size: Medium, double & ruffled

Petal Count: 25 to 30

Fragrance: Strong, citrus

Hybridizer: Swim and Weeks—1969

Parentage: (Circus x Lavender Pinocchio) x Sterling Silver

Comments: Established plants give the most bloom.

Barbra Streisand

(cv. WEKquaneze) Pat.#13,120

Rich lavender blushing darker. **Hybrid Tea**

An avid rose lover, Barbra was very choosy when it came to picking a rose that would bear her name. It had to have large flowers with an attractive color. But most of all, it must be fragrant! The Barbra Streisand rose certainly fulfills those desires. Just one big shapely blossom can nearly overpower you with strong sweet scent. The clean lavender colors show off strikingly against deep glossy green leaves. Her vigorous plant bears loads of long-stemmed beauties. Great for cutting or just for smellin'.

Height/Habit: Medium/Upright, bushy

Bloom/Size: Large, fully double

Petal Count: 25 to 30

Fragrance: Strong rose & citrus blossom

Hybridizer: Carruth—2001

Parentage: [Blue Nile x (Ivory Tower x Angel Face)] x New Zealand

Comments: Flower color & size do best in milder temps.



ROSE CLASSES

Hybrid Tea – Large flowers generally borne one per stem, medium to tall in habit, long cutting stems.

Floribunda – Medium sized flowers mostly borne in clusters, often more compact in habit, medium length stems.

Grandiflora – Large flowers borne in clusters, usually taller in habit, individual stems within each cluster are suitable for cutting.

Polyantha – Small flowers borne in very large clusters, usually compact in habit, medium-short stems.

Bloom/Size: Large, full and formal

Petal Count: 25 to 30

Fragrance: Rich rose

Hybridizer: Lammerts—1967

Parentage: Queen Elizabeth x Tawny Gold

Comments: Established plants give the most bloom. Best color & size when cool.

Betty Boop™

(cv. WEKplapic) Pat.#11,517

Yellow ivory edged red. **Floribunda**

Hey there, all you Boopsters. The beloved American animated character has been honored with a rose that matches her for spunk, sparkle, style and stamina. In fact, the colors are so catchy and the abundant blooms repeat so quickly, you'll have to boop, boop your very own doop over to examine it first hand. The naturally rounded plant carries all its long-lived flowers atop clean glossy green leaves and dark red new foliage. Destined to capture your heart.

Height/Habit: Medium/Rounded

Bloom/Size: Medium-large, semi-double

Petal Count: 6 to 12

Fragrance: Moderate fruity

Hybridizer: Carruth—1999

Parentage: Playboy x Picasso

Comments: Reblooms quickly without deadheading or shaping. Consistent in all climates.

Bing Crosby

Dark clear orange. **Hybrid Tea**

A vigorous stout-growing-rose whose glossy dark green leaves and long-lasting brilliantly-tinted blooms croon a sweet tune in the garden. Long cutting stems make Bing a 'star' in any bouquet.

Height/Habit: Tall/Upright to spreading

Bloom/Size: Large, very double

Fragrance: Light spice

Comments: Better performance in the late summer/fall bloom cycle.

Velvety dark red with near brick-red hues.

Hybrid Tea

So very dark and so very tough, this rose can withstand the hottest of climates and still come out shining like a jewel. It bears long-lasting, fully double flowers on a vigorous bush with grey-green foliage.

Height/Habit: Medium-tall/Upright

Bloom/Size: Very large, very double

Petal Count: 50 plus

Fragrance: Light tea

Hybridizer: Weeks—1981

Parentage: Mister Lincoln x Mexicana

Comments: Prefers warm night temperatures.

Blue Girl

(Kölnar Karneval)

Silvery lilac-lavender. **Hybrid Tea**

Although disguised under the guise of 'blue', the clear clean lavender tones and large blooms produced by this vigorous plant makes her a breakthrough in the older lavender roses.

Height/Habit: Medium/Bushy

Comments: Best form & size in cool weather.

Bright cherry red. Hybrid Tea

The cheerful bright color and sweet rose fragrance are a fitting tribute to the man who has brought a smile to so many of us. The large formal blooms contrast nicely against the dark green glossy foliage.

Height/Habit: Medium-tall/Upright

Bloom/Size: Large, full

Petal Count: 35 to 40

Fragrance: Rich rose

Parentage: Friedrich Schwarz x Kordes' Perfecta

Comments: Best color & size in the spring & fall.

Brandy

(cv. AROcad)

Blending of warm apricot hues. Hybrid Tea

Very lovely large classically-formed flowers possess the richest apricot color yet in roses. Elegant pointed buds are carried atop cutting stems with dark green leaves.

Requires protection in harsh climates.

Height/Habit: Medium-tall/Upright

Bloom/Size: Large, double

Petal Count: 25 to 30

Fragrance: Mild tea

Hybridizer: Swim and Christensen—1982

Parentage: First Prize x Dr. A.J. Verhage

Comments: Established plants give the most bloom. Best when cool. Not hardy.

Brass Band™

(cv. JACcofi) Pat.#9171

Melon orange & yellow bicolor. Floribunda

Some may consider this indescribable color on the brassy side. Most will find it delectable. It's not a trumpet of orange colors but a jazzy blend of melon, peach, papaya and apricot—with a lemony reverse. The scrumptious well-formed flowers are served against bright green foliage.

Height/Habit: Medium/Rounded

Bloom/Size: Medium-large, full

Petal Count: 30 to 35

Fragrance: Moderately fruity

Hybridizer: Christensen—1995

Parentage: Gold Badge x seedling

Comments: Cool weather brings the best size & more intense color.

Bride's Dream

Soft pastel pink. Hybrid Tea

Super-long elegant pastel pink buds on long low-thorned stems would make a dreamy bouquet for any bride. And *Bride's Dream* will produce enough blossoms to supply many a bride's fantasies . . . or even please those who aren't dreaming about matrimony. Although similar to its parent in color, this variety is a vast improvement in vigor, productivity & disease resistance. Medium green foliage.

Parentage: Royal Highness x seedling

Comments: Flowers may sulk some with sudden temperature changes.

An ever-changing display of colors catches the eye first on this AARS award winner. The larger pointed buds open up to a rich cream color that blushes to hues of coral pink and strawberry carmine. Very shapely flowers are produced one-to-a-stem by the vigorous plant. Large deep green leaves.

Comments: Blush color comes out with heat.

Cerise pink & cream blend. **Floribunda**

Hardly anything needs to be said beyond the name. After all these many years of worldwide propagation, a color mutation of the renowned *Iceberg* has finally occurred from the far reaches of Tasmania. The plant is exactly like its parent in every way but color—same great landscape value, same free flowering habit, same foliage, same flower form & showy clusters. It's just that the color has been kicked up a notch to a bright cerise pink painted onto cream.

Height/Habit: Medium-tall/Rounded, bushy

Bloom/Size: Medium, double, in clusters

Petal Count: 18 to 24

Fragrance: Mild honey

Hybridizer: Weatherly—2001

Parentage: Sport of Iceberg

Comments: Color intensifies in cooler conditions.

Burgundy Iceberg™

(cv. PROse) Pat.#16,198

Purple-red burgundy/cream reverse. **Floribunda**

Also available Own-Root

Performs exactly like its famous parent, *Iceberg*, in every way (except color)—same terrific flower production, bushy habit, lovely buds, showy clusters, glossy green foliage and nearly thornless stems. But 'Brother Burgundy' has the painted colors of deep purple-red burgundy & cream that are absolutely nothing like the bland whiteness of 'Mom'. Seems to always be in bloom. Perfect for the landscape—either in mass, standing alone or atop a beautiful tree rose.

Bright orange blended with copper & gold.

Hybrid Tea

'Luminescent' is the best word to describe the glowing colors of the large shapely blossoms borne on *Cary Grant*—the rose, that is. The sweetly fragrant flowers come on long strong stems and seem to take forever to fully open. Dark highly glossed foliage clothes the husky vigorous plant.

Height/Habit: Medium-tall/Slightly spreading

Bloom/Size: Large, very full

Petal Count: 35 to 40

Fragrance: Medium strong spicy

Hybridizer: Meiland—1987

Parentage: (Pharaoh x Konigin der Rosen) x seedling

Clear deep pink. **Hybrid Tea**

A super-vigorous and "flowerful" plant that seems to constantly bear large voluptuous exhibition-shaped blossoms. The hot pink tones shine through from the big pointed bud stage to the finish of each lovely flower. A proven performer for every garden.

Height/Habit: Medium-tall/Bushy

Bloom/Size: Very large, double

Petal Count: 30 to 35

Fragrance: Moderate rose

Hybridizer: Armstrong—1971

Parentage: Charlotte Armstrong x Duet

Comments: Good hot weather performer.

Cherry Parfait™

(cv. MEIsponge) Pat.#12,802

White edged lipstick red. **Grandiflora**

Cherry? Could be. Strawberry? Possible.

Scrumptious? You betcha! Swirls of white petals with a broad red edge are a sweet treat for the eyes and a sinful dessert in the garden landscape. Not your typical tall Grandi, Miss Parfait's bountiful blossoms are the perfect topping to a very rounded medium-height bushy plant with deep green clean leaves.

Height/Habit: Medium/Broadly rounded

Bloom/Size: Medium, fully double

Petal Count: 30 to 35

Fragrance: Light

Hybridizer: Meilland—2003

Parentage: Jacqueline Nebout x (MEIdinu x Matangi)

Comments: Almost shrubby in style. Loads of color in all climates.

Chicago Peace

Gaudy blend of phlox pink and canary yellow.

Hybrid Tea

First discovered in the Windy City, this brighter and deeper-toned mutation of the famous *Peace* rose has a fine reputation that follows in the footsteps of its parent. It possesses the same large opulent flowers, the same big quilted glossy apple-green leaves, and the same handsome bushy plant.

Height/Habit: Medium/Upright

Bloom/Size: Large, very double

Petal Count: 40 to 45

Fragrance: Slightly fruity
